Mr. Suskind was the Wall Street Journal's senior national affairs reporter from 1993 until 2000, and won the 1995

Pulitzer Prize for Feature Writing. He is currently the Senior Fellow at Harvard University's Edmond J. Safra Center for Ethics.

She recently participated as a member of the American Speech-Language-Hearing Association's Ad Hoc Committee on Autism Spectrum Disorders (ASD), a committee charged with developing guidelines related to the role of speech-language pathologists in the diagnosis, assessment, and treatment of ASD. She is a co-author of the SCERTS Model and lectures internationally for educational programs developing programs to foster social emotional engagement.
